The Ordinary Time of the Church, from the First Sunday after Trinity to the Last Sunday of the Church Year, comprises half of the calendar. This extended season of Green, is divided as we pass some of the lesser feasts in the coming months. Angels Tide commences as we approach the Feast of St. Michael and All Angels (September 29) and lasts until All Saints Day (November 01). The Gospel Readings around this time address the spiritual warfare of the church against the devil, the world, and all the principalities and powers of this present evil age.

New Icon Added to the Baptismal Font

The latest icon added to the baptismal font depicts Jesus forgiving the sinful woman who anointed his feet (Luke 7:36-50). “Therefore I tell you, her sins, which are many, are forgiven—for she loved much. But he who is forgiven little, loves little” (v. 47). It displays for us what baptizing with water indicates. The Small Catechism explains: “It indicates that the old Adam in us should by daily contrition and repentance be drowned and die with all sins and evil desires, and that a new man should daily emerge and arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.” Confession and Absolution is another of the pastoral acts which flow from the crucifixion of Jesus. The icons on the font are written by Avery Prozenko, a member of St. Andrew’s Lutheran Church in Halifax.
