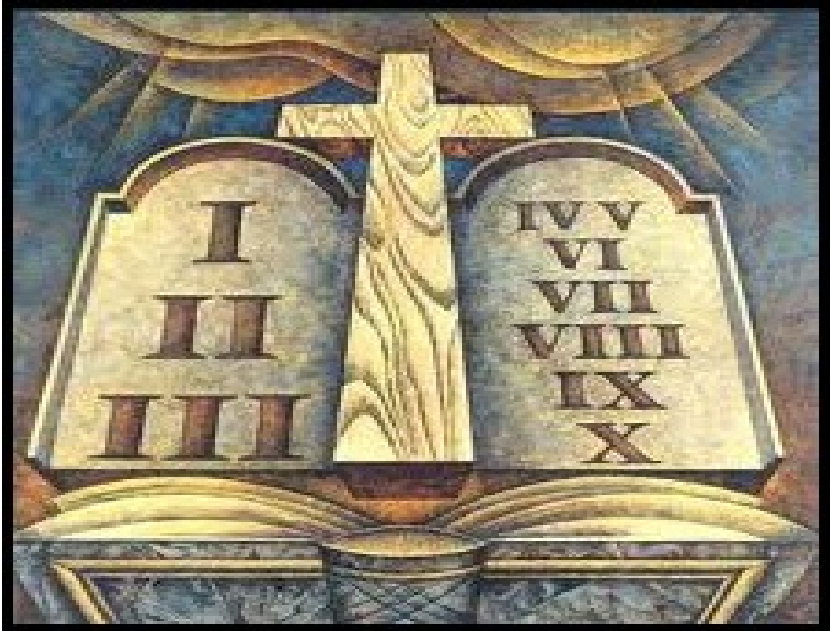

Our Order of Service

For the Sundays of Apostlestide, we will follow the order of Divine Service Setting Three, beginning on page 184 of *Lutheran Service Book*. The bulletin insert will guide you through the service and provide you with the parts that are proper for **The Sixth Sunday after Trinity**.

The Ordinary Time of the Church, from the First Sunday after Trinity to the Last Sunday of the Church Year, comprises half of the calendar. This extended season of Green, is divided as we pass some of the lesser feasts in the coming months. Apostlestide commences as we approach the Feast of the Apostles St. Peter and St. Paul (June 29). The Gospel Readings around this time address the growth and fruits of Christian faith and love, nurtured by the apostolic ministry of the Gospel.

We receive the Lord's Supper every Sunday In joyful obedience to the teaching of Scripture, the congregations of Lutheran Church-Canada practice closed communion. We would like you to commune with us, but because of the different teachings about this sacred meal we want you to know what we believe and confess before showing your agreement as you join us in this communion. Guests who desire to commune with us are thus asked to speak with the pastor to arrange for a time of instruction before giving their public confirmation of what we believe and confess. Everyone who communes should fill out a communion card and leave it in the offering plate before the service.

Opportunity for Musician to Grow in Lutheran Liturgical Heritage

Resurrection Lutheran Church, located on the campus of Brock University in St. Catharines, Ontario, is looking for an accompanist for Sunday and occasional services. The congregation is comfortable with extensive use of liturgy and hymns from “Lutheran Service Book,” 2006, Concordia Publishing House. Adaptations within the liturgical scope of the service book and the willing accommodation of the congregation make this position well suited to a musician at a competent level interested in the growth and expansion of musical talent and liturgical knowledge. The acoustically fine chapel houses an 8 rank Pole and Kingham pipe organ and a Yamaha Grand Piano. Remuneration is based at \$80 for a full Divine Service and \$55 for a Minor Office, subject to increase with experience and proficiency.
