#### Visitors to the Lord's Table

"The **Mass** is held among us and celebrated with the highest reverence. All those able to do so partake of the **Sacrament** together. No one is admitted to the Sacrament without first being examined. The people are also advised about the dignity and use of the Sacrament, about how it brings great consolation to anxious consciences, so that they too may learn to believe God and to expect and ask from Him all that is good. Such use of the Sacrament nourishes true devotion toward God" (AC XXIV). So our Lutheran Confessions state concerning the service of **Holy Communion**. Guests desiring to commune are thus asked to speak with the pastor to arrange for a time of instruction and public confession of our shared beliefs.

## What Is That? - Words You Only Hear at Church

<u>Pastor's Vestments</u>: A pastor wears various vestments to cover up his individuality. The focus is not to be upon the man but upon the Office to which he has been called. In some ways the vestments may be equated to the uniform a police officer wears in the sense that a police officer's uniform communicates his office and not his person. You may see various vestments in a Lutheran congregation.

<u>Cassock</u> - A full-length, black garment is worn under other vestments. In addition to the clergy, the cassock may also be worn by others, including acolytes and choir members.

<u>Surplice</u> - A flowing, white vestment worn over a cassock. The cassock/surplice combination is frequently worn at prayer services (Matins, Vespers, etc.) when Holy Communion is not celebrated. It is also the vestment frequently worn by other assistants (e.g., acolytes) and by choir members.
