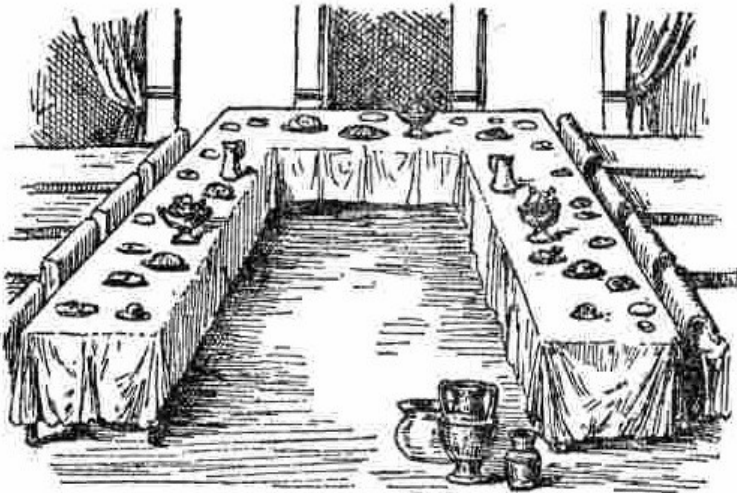

The Ordinary Time of the Church, from the First Sunday after Trinity to the Last Sunday of the Church Year, comprises half of the calendar. This extended season of Green, is divided as we pass some of the lesser feasts in the coming months. Martyrs Tide commences as we approach the Feast of St. Lawrence (August 10) and lasts until the Feast of St. Michael and All Angels (September 29). The Gospel Readings around this time address the growth and fruits of Christian faith and love, manifested in bearing the cross, even unto death.

Our Order of Service

For the Sundays of Martyrs Tide, we will follow the order of Divine Service Setting One, beginning on page 151 of *Lutheran Service Book*. The bulletin insert will guide you through the service and provide you with the parts that are proper for **The Seventeenth Sunday after Trinity**.

We receive the Lord's Supper every Sunday In joyful obedience to the teaching of Scripture, the congregations of Lutheran Church-Canada practice closed communion. We would like you to commune with us, but because of the different teachings about this sacred meal we want you to know what we believe and confess before showing your agreement as you join us in this communion. Guests who desire to commune with us are thus asked to speak with the pastor to arrange for a time of instruction before giving their public confirmation of what we believe and confess. Everyone who communes should fill out a communion card and leave it in the offering plate before the service.

New Icon Added to the Baptismal Font

The latest icon added to the baptismal font depicts Jesus forgiving the sinful woman who anointed his feet (Luke 7:36-50). "Therefore I tell you, her sins, which are many, are forgiven—for she loved much. But he who is forgiven little, loves little" (v. 47). It displays for us what baptizing with water indicates. The Small Catechism explains: "It indicates that the old Adam in us should by daily contrition and repentance be drowned and die with all sins and evil desires, and that a new man should daily emerge and arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever." Confession and Absolution is another of the pastoral acts which flow from the crucifixion of Jesus. The icons on the font are written by Avery Prozenko, a member of St. Andrew's Lutheran Church in Halifax.
