Our Order of Service

For the Time of Easter (Septuagesima, Lent, and Easter) we will follow the order of Divine Service Setting One, beginning on page 151 of *Lutheran Service Book*. During Lent the paraments are violet and we silence our "Alleluias" and the Greater Gloria (Glory to God in the highest...) until Easter. The bulletin insert will guide you through the service and provide you with the parts that are proper for **The Fifth Sunday in Lent (Judica)**.

Passiontide begins with the Fifth Sunday of Lent and runs through Holy Week. It signals that we are nearing the end of our Lenten fast and the feast of Easter is not far away. During Passiontide we restrict ourselves to an even greater degree as we sing the liturgy. We now remove the Lesser Gloria (Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit...) from our songs. We also restrict our eyes from viewing the holy cross so that we may regard it with all the more appreciation when it is restored to our eyes, even as we will sing our songs with all the more joy when we celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord.

We receive the Lord's Supper every Sunday In joyful obedience to the teaching of Scripture, the congregations of Lutheran Church-Canada practice closed communion. We would like you to commune with us, but because of the different teachings about this sacred meal we want you to know what we believe and confess before showing your agreement as you join us in this communion. Guests who desire to commune with us are thus asked to speak with the pastor to arrange for a time of instruction before giving their public confirmation of what we believe and confess. Everyone who communes should fill out a communion card and leave it in the offering plate before the service.
