Our Order of Service

For the Sundays of Martyrs Tide, we will follow the order of Divine Service Setting One, beginning on page 151 of *Lutheran Service Book*. The bulletin insert will guide you through the service and provide you with the parts that are proper for **The Thirteenth Sunday after Trinity**.

The Ordinary Time of the Church, from the First Sunday after Trinity to the Last Sunday of the Church Year, comprises half of the calendar. This extended season of Green, is divided as we pass some of the lesser feasts in the coming months. Martyrs Tide commences as we approach the Feast of St. Lawrence (August 10). The Gospel Readings around this time address the growth and fruits of Christian faith and love, manifested in bearing the cross, even unto death.

We receive the Lord's Supper every Sunday In joyful obedience to the teaching of Scripture, the congregations of Lutheran Church-Canada practice closed communion. We would like you to commune with us, but because of the different teachings about this sacred meal we want you to know what we believe and confess before showing your agreement as you join us in this communion. Guests who desire to commune with us are thus asked to speak with the pastor to arrange for a time of instruction before giving their public confirmation of what we believe and confess. Everyone who communes should fill out a communion card and leave it in the offering plate before the service.
