Visitors to the Lord's Table

At His Baptism in the Jordan River, Jesus identified completely with us sinful human beings and took His first public step towards the cross. As He did so, the Holy Spirit anointed Him and the Father was well pleased! The Baptism Of Our Lord thus tells us that God is for us and determined to work out our redemption. The **Lord's Supper** tells us that God is still for us and has, in fact, worked out our redemption. Here the very body and blood with which Christ earned our forgiveness is given to us to eat and to drink. In joyful obedience to Scripture, we practice closed communion, and guests desiring to commune are kindly asked to speak with the pastor to arrange for a time of instruction before communing.

St. Matthew's Evangelical Lutheran Church located at Smithville, Ontario, was formed in 1945 as a congregation of the Slovak District of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. In 1989, St. Matthew's made the transfer to Lutheran Church-Canada. In the last year, the decision was made to disband. In November 2025 ownership of the property was transferred to Lutheran Church-Canada. A short order of "Closing of a Congregation" and "Disposition of a Church Building" will be conducted by Hamilton Circuit Counsellor, Rev. Kevin Walrath, at the St. Matthew location, 6441 Townline Road, Smithville, ON. We thank the Lord for choosing to use St. Matthew's congregation for His purposes in proclaiming the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. We shall recognize that reality and give Him praise.

New Panel Added to the Baptismal Font

Have you noticed the new piece of artwork added to the font, on the side facing the pulpit? This fourth panel depicts Jesus preaching and teaching crowds of people, including men, women, and children. In His hand he holds a scroll of Scripture. The icon is the work of Lutheran artist Avery Prozenko (a member of St. Andrew's Lutheran Church, Halifax), whose style is a blend of the Coptic and German Lutheran traditions.
