
ASH WEDNESDAY

Ashes are offered to those entering the church. Using the right thumb, the pastor or an assistant places the ashes on the forehead of each person in the sign of the cross, saying:

Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.

After receiving the ashes, each person takes his place in silence. There is no statement of dismissal.

and graciously to hear our prayers:




