Visitors to the Lord's Table

St. Peter's great confession of faith in Jesus, "You are the Christ" (Mark 8:29), is heard every Sunday in the communion liturgy: "O Christ, Thou Lamb of God, that takest away the sin of the world, have mercy upon us." As we partake of His very body and blood in and under the bread and the wine in the **Lord's Supper**, we, too, are also confessing that same faith; as St. Paul writes: "For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until He comes" (1 Cor. 11:26). Since partaking of the Lord's Supper is a confession of our common faith in the apostles' doctrine, we thus practice closed communion and ask that guests speak with the pastor to arrange for a time of instruction before communing.

CNE Releases Initial Slate for 2026 LCC Convention

Following a synod-wide nomination process conducted by the Commission on Nominations and Elections (CNE), the initial slate of nominees for LCC boards and commissions, as well as for the board of regents of both seminaries. At this time, the recommended slates for some boards or commissions remain incomplete, with an insufficient number of nominees in certain lay or rostered worker categories, or a lack of representation from specific circuits.
