Visitors to the Lord's Table

On All Saint's Day (November 01) we remember those who have been called to heaven and especially how richly God blessed them with faith and with its fulfillment. Death does not separate us from them, and our praise is joined with theirs as we worship the Lamb who was slain. As we receive the **Lord's Supper** today, we also recall that He who is here with His body and blood is at the same time hosting the feast of victory in heaven (see the cover illustration by Emma Zamani). Until we join in that feast, the most loving thing we can do for all people is to set forth the truth of God's Word. For this reason we practice closed communion, and guests are asked to speak with the pastor to arrange for a time of instruction before publicly confessing this faith with us at this supper.

Mission Minute: New Pastor for Nuer Lutheran Church, Calgary

Rev. Joseph Nhial, a recent graduate of Lutheran Church-Canada's Pastors with Alternate Training (PAT) program, was ordained and installed on September 20, 2025, at Grace Lutheran Church Calgary, where he will serve the South Sudanese Nuer Lutheran Church Fellowship. The Nuer Lutherans have been worshipping in Calgary for more than 20 years, with outreach to other South Sudanese communities in Southern Alberta. Approximately 300 people gathered for the festive service, followed by a meal.
